## Pastor's Pen

#### Words for the Beginning

Our lives are made up of beginnings and endings. The changing of the seasons is particularly obvious right now as we have watched leaves change colors and fall from the trees and snow begins to coat the ground. We know that spring will bring new leaves and new life, but it is a new beginning for which we must wait. The season of Advent is also the season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. But Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new.

Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike—all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet as we step into the unknown.

This year, we are exploring Advent with a worship series filled with the blessing of words we need to hear again and again as we begin a new season. The series was created by imagining the words Mary would speak to her newborn son. What scriptures and stories would she impart to him? What lessons would she teach him as he grew? And so, our weekly themes may feel like the lessons we teach to children, but in reality, these are lessons we continue to learn and relearn as adults. I invite you to enter this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead.

As we journey through this season together, may you find words for belovedness and hope. May you find words for beginning again. For no matter what you are facing, no matter what this new day brings, love is your beginning.



**December 1**<sup>st</sup> – "**Soul Shop**": In part one of this Biblically based series, the topic of what leads to suicidal desperation, how to identify its signs, and what we can do to intervene with family and friends to prevent the completion of a suicide attempt will be explored.

**December 8**th – "*Heart of my Soul*" – second book by Janet Kurtz: "*The Heart of my Soul: Tales of Five Generations at the Family Cabin*" will be the core of this week's Adult Forum. Jan's second book is a compilation of family letters, essays, snippets of handed down sayings and the

oral tradition practiced around bonfires, scripted for the future. She will read a few examples from her family stories and lead an activity in story-telling. With Christmas gatherings in the near future, maybe this is the year to tell or retell family lore, leaving a legacy, not just of physical inheritance, but of beliefs, humor, and a foundation of people that shed light on who we are and make us think about what we want to pass along. 
# UCC Volunteers for the Warming Shelter Bridge on 7th

The Council meeting was called to order with prayer.

Food for thought: how to help more when there are things that need to be done.

A written report needs to be done outlining how the money was spent by the Church during Leslie's Renewal Time.

There was an agreement by Council members that there still to be a discussion about the church's safety during worship hour and other church events.

It was moved to accept the September's minutes and the August's minutes submitted for approval at the next council meeting.

The Foundation submitted funds to reimburse partial amount for the "City Street Construction" with \$8,874 and in 2025 the Foundation plans to reimburse the final balance to the church.

There was discussion about financial planning for the end of life---- how church members can leave donations to the church. Suggestion: a memorial insurance policy can be taken out to leave money to the church.

Adjourned: 5:25pm



**Sunday, January 5<sup>th</sup> -** You may have read or heard that we are considering changing our name, not our denomination, just the name. It's a long process; the next step is to discuss it at this Adult Forum. Come with questions and thoughts. Thanks!

## Should We Change the Name of Our Church?

I submitted a number of ideas to our church Council for reorganizing our church. I said we might even consider changing our name. I didn't expect that would get any interest, but some people began to discuss it. There were even a few suggestions. I approached the church Council January 18<sup>th</sup> asking for permission to officially explore this idea. At that meeting the Council voted yes and charged me with gathering information and exploring the idea of possibly changing our name.

**No, we don't have to** Some churches change their name as they merge with another congregation. In the case of Mayflower UCC in Minneapolis, that name is now associated with slavery and genocide. Plymouth Congregational in Minneapolis is Congregational (but it is not UCC.)

Why should we consider a change? A conversation with Rev. Kelly Gallagher (our Minnesota UCC Conference Associate Minister) noted that the denomination has not been purely "Congregational" since 1957 when we became the United Church of Christ. Other churches have renamed (New Journey – Hutchinson UCC and New Spirit – Savage UCC) and she said we should talk to them about the process. I did that. They were most helpful.

People are leaving churches that do not fulfill their needs or where they don't feel welcome. I believe some of those people are looking for us! When they search for an open, progressive church our name will be one of the first things they see. A name that reflects who we are will entice them to open the door to see what's inside!

<u>Are we leaving the United Church of Christ?</u> No. Let's be clear that we will always be United Church of Christ (UCC.) We are not changing our affiliation. We are proposing changing the *First Congregational* part of our name. Our neighbor church Park United Methodist (PUMC) is now going by "Park Church." They had the option to shorten and simplify.

<u>But I like our name!</u> Keeping our current name is an option. "No Change" will be an option after our exploration. There's nothing wrong with our name. We don't have to change our name. But I think this is an opportunity to reflect who we are now.

<u>The Process</u> This is the first step; simply marking this as a starting point and proceeding to take in all viewpoints. We will take time to reach a conclusion. Now is a time for taking suggestions and ideas, discussing the pro's and con's and hearing everyone's voice. Adult Forums and small groups could serve as discussions for this topic.

<u>What's in a Name?</u> I learned years ago that naming is remarkably important. It is part of a first impression. It can work for you or against you.

<u>We want your ideas!</u> There are no bad ideas. Frequently, one person's idea will spark a great idea! We want to make sure we choose a name that is easy to say and reflects who we are. We will be careful to choose a name that isn't trendy. It needs to be memorable. There's nothing wrong with having the same name as another church that isn't too close by. (There are 3 Peace UCC's in Minnesota.)

<u>What's next?</u> Put the question in your brain and let it percolate. You may be surprised at how many ideas come to you. Then send them to me. I think sharing ideas and insights as they come in may spark other ideas. I assume submissions will ebb and flow but after a while we'll have a number of great choices. But remember, you are welcome to vote "none of the above. Keep it First Congregational." I don't think I/we will share who submitted which suggestion. I will, however, note duplicate suggestions.


